BIBLE READINGS

Acts 17 vv 22-31; 1 Peter 3 vv 13-22; John 14 vv 15-21 <u>Link between the readings</u>: The Acts reading speaks of an unknown God who is made known in Jesus and his resurrection. John develops this further, in the promise of the Spirit who draws Jesus' followers into the love that lies in the heart of God. For Peter this relationship with the God of Good Friday and Easter is the ground of confidence and blessing in a challenging world.

REFLECTION ON JOHN 14 v 15-21 & 26 From Peter's perspective.

We were all there in the upper room with Jesus eating the Passover meal together. He was explaining to us what will happen when He leaves us.

We were all confused and I was broken hearted at the thought of Jesus not being with us anymore. I had previously asked Him where are you going Lord, because I would follow Him anywhere. He said where I am going, you cannot follow. None of us want to be left without Him, we couldn't imagine being separated from Him. But I was uplifted to hear Him say that He would not leave us alone, like orphans. He was going to ask the Father to give us a Helper, who is called the Holy Spirit, who will be with us for ever. The Holy Spirit will help us, teach us and prompt us to remember all Jesus taught when He is no longer with us.

Jesus had commanded us to love one another, just like He loves us and because of this love, He said everyone will recognise and know that we are His disciples. He showed us this tremendous love when He washed our feet!

Then Jesus said that, "the world will see Me no more, but you will see Me." And "in that day you will know that I am in the Father and you in Me and I in you." I was puzzled at this and didn't understand what He meant. We do have to keep His commandments to show we love Him and because we do this, the Father will love us too, as Jesus does.

I still feel confused, but there is one thing I do know, that I trust Jesus without question.

I still think this message as it stands, is quite hard to understand today, even with the benefit of the written Word in the Bible. It only becomes clear after Pentecost. We just have to believe, trust and accept what Jesus tells us through His Word.
