LORD'S PRAYER.

O God, You search me and You know me, all my thoughts lie open to Your gaze. When I walk or lie down, You are before me, ever the maker and keeper of my days.

You know my resting and my rising. You discern my purpose from afar, And with love everlasting You besiege me: in every moment of life or death, You are.

BIBLE READING - Romans 6 v 12-23

- ¹²Therefore do not let sin reign in your mortal body so that you obey its evil desires. ¹³Do not offer the parts of your body to sin, as instruments of wickedness, but rather offer yourselves to God, as those who have been brought from death to life; and offer the parts of your body to Him as instruments of righteousness. ¹⁴ For sin shall not be your master, because you are not under law but under grace.
- What then? Shall we sin because we are not under law but under grace? By no means! Don't you know that when you offer yourself to someone to obey them as slaves, you are slaves to the one whom you obey whether you are slaves to sin, which leads to death, or to obedience which leads to righteousness? ¹⁷ But thanks be to God, that though you used to be slaves to sin, you wholeheartedly obeyed the form of teaching to which you were entrusted. ¹⁸ You have been set free from sin and become slaves to righteousness.
- ¹⁹ I put this in human terms because you are weak in your natural selves. Just as you used to offer the parts of your body in slavery to impurity and to ever-increasing wickedness, so now offer them in slavery to righteousness, leading to holiness. ²⁰ When you were slaves to sin, you were free from the control of righteousness. ²¹ What benefit did you reap at that time from the things you are now ashamed of? These things result in death! ²² But now that you have been set free from sin and become slaves to God, the benefit you reap lead to holiness, and the result is eternal life. ²³ For the wages of sin is death, but the gift of God is eternal life through Christ Jesus our Lord. **Amen**

BIBLE READING Matthew 10 v 40-42

⁴⁰ "He who receives you receives Me, and he who receives Me receives the One who sent Me. ⁴¹ Anyone who receives a prophet because he is a prophet will receive a prophet's reward, and anyone who receives a righteous man because he is a righteous man will receive a righteous man's reward. ⁴² And if anyone gives even a cup of cold water to one of these little ones because he is my disciple, I tell you the truth he will certainly not lose his reward. **Amen.**

REFLECTION.

BE LIKE JESUS..... LITTLE THINGS ARE IMPORTANT..... MEET THE NEED.

When lockdown first began, as well as an excellent written circuit service, I was depending very much on the TV services (unfortunately my You-tube was not working!) so I could see someone else and sing with other people as I worshipped. Things have improved —I can now get sound on my You-tube and, since lockdown began to ease, have been enjoying Garden and Chicken Church (curious? ... get in touch!). However as I read this week's lectionary passages and prayed about the theme, 'A cup of cold water', I was reminded of words of St David quoted a few times on the TV services: "Be joyful, keep the faith and do the little things".

Before reflecting on those words, and the words of Jesus, 'If anyone gives even a cup of cold water....' (Matt 10 v42), I want to reflect a bit more on the words which Paul wrote to the church in Rome. Part of the passage is entitled 'Slaves to righteousness' and a commentator on the passage reminds us, 'In certain skilled crafts, an apprentice trains under a master who trains, shapes and moulds his apprentices of his craft'. As spiritual people, we chose a master and are called to pattern ourselves after Him. Two weeks ago the service included the lovely hymn 'I want to walk with Jesus Christ'. Can we make those words our prayer?

I want to learn to speak of Him, my life must show that He lives in me.
My deeds, my thoughts, my words must speak all of His love for me.
I want to learn to read his word, For this is how I know the way
To live my life as it pleases Him, in holiness and joy.

What changes could we make during/after lockdown to be more like Jesus? BE LIKE JESUS —to whom LITTLE THINGS ARE SO IMPORTANT.

Jesus' teaching – many of the parables, Jesus' actions –blessing the children, His comment on the widow's mite, and His words, in today's gospel reading – 'If anyone gives even a cup of cold water' – all remind us of the importance of little things. Yes it is a 'big' thing – a big responsibility, a big privilege to be God's church in Britain in this 21st century and in this pandemic, especially if, as Paul encouraged the Roman Christians, we try to follow Jesus' teaching with our whole heart (v17). And, yes, some of the things we are called to think and do and say may seem 'big' especially if they are, as the covenant service reminds us, 'against our natural inclinations and material interests'. Then it's easy to think that what we can do is only small and forget the bigger picture – remember the workman who was sweeping the floor and when asked what he was doing replied 'I'm helping to build a cathedral'; while, during the current pandemic, we have certainly learnt who the 'key workers 'are in our society! Of course we may also lack confidence in our own gifts and skills compared to other people, and all sorts of other reasons, but little things are important as the African proverb reminds us, 'If you think what you do is too small to make a difference, try sleeping in a room with a mosquito!' And remember too how the words of the Covenant Service continue 'The power to do all these things is given to us in Christ who strengthens us'

BE LIKE JESUS...... LITTLE THINGS ARE IMPORTANT.... AND MEET THE NEED.

One of the things I've been enjoying during lockdown is watching the programmes about different factories — 'Keeping Britain Going'; extra shifts to provide enough baked beans; temporarily stopping production of flavoured tea bags in order to produce more 'builders tea' etc. One of the challenges facing us as Christians and as churches going forward, is meeting people's needs — because that means that often we need to build up relationships, take time and seek God's help, to understand what their needs really are. The Old Testament prophets often challenged the Israelite people — God didn't want only their worship (important though it was) but, equally important, were lives which showed both an understanding and a care for the needs of those around them. Jesus' teaching, and the letters in the New Testament give the same message. Sometimes for all sorts of reasons, like Naaman the leper when asked to bathe in the River Jordan, we want to do 'something bigger' than 'give a cup of water' in Jesus name; but if we do that whose needs are being met?!

Time and time again we need to ask 'What would Jesus do'.....

I want to close by quoting the last verse of one of the hymns which would have been sung at Andrew's ordination this afternoon:

Ready for all Thy perfect will, My acts of faith and love repeat;
Till death Thy endless mercies seal, And make the sacrifice complete.

(from 'O thou who camest from above' by Charles Wesley).

May we each be able to make them <u>our</u> prayer. **Amen.**
