Matthew 6 v 25 - 34

"Therefore I tell you, do not worry about your life, what you will eat or drink; or about your body, what you will wear. Is not life more than food and the body more than clothes? Look at the birds of the air; they do not sow or reap or store away in barns, and yet your heavenly Father feeds them. Are you not much more valuable than they? Can any one of you by worrying add a single hour to your life?

"And why do you worry about clothes? See how the flowers of the field grow. They do not labour or spin. Yet I tell you that not even Solomon in all his splendour was dressed like one of these. If that is how God clothes the grass of the field, which is here today and tomorrow is thrown into the fire, will he not much more clothe you—you of little faith? Reflection

The OT lectionary reading for this Sunday is a story from the book of Genesis, which may still have relevance for us today. It concerns slavery, domestic tension and a desperate situation. Hagar was a female slave in Abraham's household, and Abraham was father to her young son, Ishmael. Sarah, Abraham's wife, was, perhaps understandably, hostile to Hagar and the ill-feeling, which the rivalry between the two women generated, caused Sarah to put pressure on her husband to get rid of the slave and her son. So Abraham, apparently with the Lord's approval, turned both Hagar and young Ishmael out of their home. He gave them a supply of bread and water to afford them some relief as they departed 'into the wilderness'. It was in their wanderings there that Hagar was plunged into deep distress and fear. Their food and water had gone; they were hungry and weary as they trudged along the desert track, with no-one to meet them or to offer help. In desperation, Hagar left her child in the shade of some bushes and moved some distance away to avoid witnessing the death of her son. It was then that God came to their help!

Hearing the cry of the boy, the Lord drew near and assured Hagar of His concern. 'What are you troubled about, Hagar?' He asked. 'Do not be afraid'. And God promised that, not only would they survive, but, in years to come, Ishmael would become the founder of a 'great nation'. This promise gave rise to a tradition that it was from Ishmael that the Arab races sprung. Today, we live in a time of uncertainty. We may not experience such anguish as was felt by Hagar, but for many people there is suffering, grief, fear and a sense of helplessness. The message of our Bible story is that, even in the dark shadows, God's light will break through. **We are not alone.** Sometimes, before we even realise it, God is there to help us.

I once knew and elderly local preacher, whose wife had died and he was left alone, in need of care, for he was unable to manage on his own. A neighbour and his wife took the old man into their home and looked after him for the rest of his life. Speaking of this experience, the preacher attributed his good fortune and the kindness of his friends to God's presence with him throughout his life. He quoted two lines of a hymn by Isaac Watts ('God is the refuge of the saints' Hymns and Psalms No.53):

"Ere we can offer our complaints Behold Him present with His aid"

And so, in our times of anxiety and stress, may our trust in our Heavenly Father enable us to hear the words he spoke to Hagar, 'What are you troubled about? Do not be afraid"
