From the Manse

The 'future' of the church.

Young people who go to church up and down the country are likely to share something in common with each other. I am referring to a phrase that I heard and you may have heard as a child 'you are the future of the church'. While most people understand the sentiment behind it, it does cause us to ask questions: When does the present become the future? Will there be a church if there is no young people? If there are young people, why aren't they the church today?

As a younger person I found myself scared about becoming a Christian because I thought it was a thing for adults, not seeing people around me my own age with a faith. When I felt a call to preach at 13, I thought this to be silly and put it off until I was a bit older. 'maybe in my 20's' I said to myself. The church in many ways was not something I thought of as for me. It was something for older people, but which I am allowed to play a part in. Christ tells us this is untrue, welcoming the children to himself when they were being turned away by the disciples. It was to these children the kingdom was for, in fact Jesus goes as far to say the approach of a child to the kingdom of God was necessary for people to take note of if anyone wanted to enter it.

Recently the Pope was doing a service, in a grand way as is often the case. A video emerged of this particular service which showed a child who had got onto the stage, was walking around, doing a bit of a dance and looking generally oblivious to what was going on around them, much to the shock of the Cardinals and Pope who were watching this. I am pleased to say the child was able to continue to exercise this freedom he had found, and the Pope used this to make a point about the freedom we do or do not experience in God's presence. The video is on the internet if you care to find it. This child preached to the congregation that day if they were willing to hear it and preached to the Pope. Children and young people have just as much right to be in our congregations as those who are older, a truth I sadly did not realise when I was younger.

But this may also cause us to be challenged and to question why on earth it is that we have less children coming to our church services? We might well feel upset that our culture is not like it was when we grew up, but the call of the church is to witness to the culture in which we find ourselves in, not the world as it was.

Last quarter Appleby did a family service following on from the kids club that happened. We had a number of families come to that who would not have otherwise come to church. The service looked different to both the regular attenders and the new people coming, which presented us with an opportunity. The opportunity was to learn from each other, sing songs which those who came to kids club knew, and then some songs those who came to church knew. To pray together, but realising we had learned to say Amen in different ways. We had a shorter service, recognising the attention of younger people isn't the same as older people, yet at the end we may have stayed longer chatting with each other and enjoying each other's company in the presence of God.

But this also provided us with a challenge, and I feel it is a challenge that we may find across our circuit. How do we invite people in to the worshipping congregation, when the whole experience is alien to them, and may even seem irrelevant to them? It calls us to reconsider our purpose as a church, and wonder whether our aims in worship match our practice. As we explored our mission plans which Stephen brought to the circuit to consider, we may well find ourselves challenged by what is written there, and cause us to rethink the ways we have got used to in the way we 'do' church. But this also offers us a moment to reconsider the purposes God has for this area which we serve in Christ's name.


